Hawkins Receives State STEM Designation!

In May of 2023 the state of Ohio recognized Hawkins as an officially designated STEM school. Only 4 schools in all of Ohio were accepted this year! Ohio law provides a specific pathway for schools to seek and receive designation as a STEM, and designation recognizes a school as an effective place for STEM learning.

Schools apply for designation from the Ohio STEM Committee, a committee of state and community leaders. The process includes a written document with evidence supporting STEM processes and, if the committee approves of the written document, a site visit by STEM school leaders and state representatives to view a typical school day at Hawkins. These leaders visited Hawkins in March 2023 and we very impressed with the students and staff for their commitment to STEM.

The goal for STEMM at Hawkins STEMM Academy is to promote high academic achievement through project-based learning, to ignite students to become innovative thinks and problem solvers. We use a student–directed process to creatively solve real-world problems while integrating Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, and Medicine. With our location next to Toledo Botanical Garden Metropark, our vision is a welcoming, flexible, nurturing atmosphere emphasizing students as engaged participants in the natural world. We are in Sync with Nature. Our learning is rooted in stewardship, inclusion, curiosity, perseverance, and community.

Have you seen our prairie growing at Hawkins STEMM? Last spring, with the help of naturalists from the Toledo Zoo, students prepared the ground and planted seeds to grow our own pocket prairie. This summer, some lovely native plants have started growing and a variety of insects and animals are moving in. Teachers attended professional development over the summer to learn how to utilize our prairie as a learning lab for student investigations. From our community partner, Epworth UMC

Epworth-Hawkins Partnership volunteers will be busy with many activities as the school year begins. Kindergarten Family Night will take place in September (the exact date will be set after consultation with kindergarten teachers). At this event, the Epworth Hawkins Partnership gives each kindergarten family in attendance a book to read with their child. Epworth volunteers provide childcare while kindergarten teachers talk to parents/guardians about the benefits of reading with your child. The evening concludes with a pizza meal for all family members.

Our Reader Bag program for students in grades 1 and 2 will resume in September. Students can borrow a bag with two age-appropriate books every week. When the bag is returned, the student can borrow two different books. Volunteers check in and distribute books weekly.

A new program planned for October will be a Second Grade Family Literacy Night at the Reynolds Corners branch library. Library staff will share early literacy resources with families and the Epworth-Hawkins Partnership will provide pizza, beverages, and a gift card drawing.

Volunteers will also assist Mr. Loge in the library and tutoring will begin later in the fall in response to teacher referrals.

Spirit Day (1st Friday each Month) Dress Code

My name is Emily Bishop and I am your school counselor. I see students one on one, in pairs, in small groups, and deliver classroom lessons. My focus depends on the needs of the school under the umbrellas of social emotional learning, academic support, and careers. My role is to work with the entire student population. My door is open for students to stop in and chat (with teacher permission first [©]), or for school employees and parent/guardians to refer students to me. I like to keep the lines of communication open. You can reach me by calling the school, or through email, which is below my signature. I will do my best to keep communication strong. However, I am split between two schools, so if you don't hear back from me right away, just know that I will get back to you the next day I am at Hawkins STEMM. Sometimes a student may come to my room "here or there" to talk, or might eat lunch in my room with a friend. I might not call you if it is not a big issue or just a "fun lunch". However, if the problem requires ongoing counseling/therapy, or it seems like your student needs psychological help, I will definitely contact you. I also will send permission forms home and/or call/email if your child is referred to work in a small group with me, or if a teacher/principal refers your child for multiple meetings with me. If you have certain concerns about your child's personal situation, please reach out. I look forward to a campy adventure of a year with you!

Immunization Requirements

Please send in your students updated immunizations records if entering kindergarten, 7th grade or if you are new to the TPS family. Students who have not submitted a complete record will be excluded from school starting 10/2/2023.

Kindergarten:

- DTaP/DT: 5 doses
- POLIO: 3-4 doses
- MMR: 2 doses
- HEP B: 3 doses
- VARICELLA: 2 doses

7th grade:

- TDAP
- Meningitis

Important Building Procedures

- Security We are continuing a security and contact tracing requirement that EVERY person who enters the building must provide their state ID in the main office. The ID will be scanned by the RAPTOR Visitor Management System. This system screens and tracks everyone coming in and out of TPS buildings. Accurate and reliable visitor details and sign-in history are recorded for every visitor that enters our schools which includes COVID questioning for tracing purposes if needed. The system checks visitors against a custom database set by TPS, which may contain custody alerts and/or banned visitors.
- Early Pickup The end of the school day at Hawkins tends to be very busy. If your child needs to be released early, please do so before 2:45 p.m. No exceptions!
- Dismissal Please follow all staff directions at dismissal. Just a reminder, we need to leave space for the busses to park and to follow the appropriate traffic patterns at dismissal. Students K-1 are dismissed at 3:10 p.m. and grades the rest of the building begins to dismiss at 3:15 p.m.

T.A.C.K.L.E., A School-Based Services Program

The T.A.C.K.L.E. program will return to Hawkins this school year. The goal of the program is to "build collaborative relationships with schools and community resources to address the mental health and school success of children and adolescents." The program provides consultation to parents, intervention for students, and resource connections for families. Our T.A.C.K.L.E. case manager is Ms. Reagan Boice. Dress Code

We have adopted the following dress code for all students who attend Hawkins STEMM Academy. It is expected that all students will comply with the dress code, beginning with the first day of school. Parents and students are equally responsible for the appearance of the student.

ITEM	DESCRIPTION OF ALLOWABLE ITEMS
TOPS	Any color or pattern; No graphics or text.
Collars at all times with the excep- tion of spirit wear.	Blouses, dress shirts, polo shirts, and button down shirts with a collar as well as turtle- necks, sweaters/cardigans (no hoods), TPS/HAWKINS spirit wear t-shirts or sweatshirts (crew neck only, no hoodies).
	Collars must be worn at all times with the exception of spirit wear.
BOTTOMS Must be worn at the waist.	Solid colors are encouraged but not limited to blue/navy, khaki/tan, black, brown, or gray; No graphics or text. Skirts, jumpers, dress or casual pants, slacks, corduroy pants, shorts, capris, and skorts. All items must be just above knee length or longer. No jeans, jeggings, leggings, yoga pants or sweat suits permitted.
SWEATER/JACKETS No hoods/hoodies.	Any color or pattern; No graphics or text. Cardigans, pullovers, jackets or vest in any color fleece or fabric. Light weights jackets only. No hoods permitted on items. Collars must be worn at all times with the exception of spirit wear.
SHOES/BOOTS/TENNIS SHOES	Any color or pattern; No graphics or text Shoes/Boots/Tennis Shoes with enclosed heels and toes. No platforms, slippers, slides, or Crocs.

*Students who do not comply with the dress code are subject to progressive disciplinary action. *School Administration reserves the right to make the final determination if clothes are appropriate.
