Hawkins "BioBlitz"

Hawkins STEMM is participating in Toledo Zoo Project PRAIRIE 2023
Bioblitz! Project Prairie is a conservation education program that installs prairies on school campuses in northwest Ohio. Students planted seeds last November, additional plant plugs in May, and our prairie is now growing! The bioblitz is a yearly fall project to document the organisms found on each school prairie. Additionally, teachers and students use the bioblitz time to conduct inquiry investigations and engage in other citizen science projects in the prairie. The bioblitz runs from September 18-October 9. Hawkins STEMM has identified 91 different species so far in our prairie using the iNaturalist app. Families are encouraged to download the free app and take photographs of plants and animals in our prairie outside of school hours. Your photographs will be studied by students and scientists recording the diversity in our prairie.

Classroom "BioBlitz" Updates

o Mr. Bryant's 2nd graders have been observing bugs in the prairie. They have been recording different types of butterflies, spiders, grasshoppers, and bees. The children have noticed some broken open nuts





in the prairie and are also interested in the presence of squirrels in the area. The students are beginning to research where some of these animals will go for the winter.

Hawkins Updates

More "BioBlitz" & Classroom News

- Mrs. Craig's 8th graders assisted third graders with their BioBlitz adventure by helping them identify indigenous birds that may be in the prairie. (see photos to the right)
- Mr. Diller's class has been going outside every day during the BioBlitz to our prairie. Students are counting how many of the "creature" of the day we see while walking around the prairie. We are looking up any new species we may encounter. We are learning how to use new science tools too. We will be working on adding two 2 digit numbers soon.





- 4th graders in Mrs. Brady's class had to follow clues about animal tracks, diets and habits to solve a mystery. Very engaging learning took place. (see photos to the left)
- Mr. Godfrey's 6th grade students toured the Sauder Village and had a chance to work with the

designers there. (photo on right)

• Students in Mrs. Kreamer's class learned about the birds in their neighborhood from Mrs. McLaughlin. They were able to look at feeders that people use around their neighborhood and choose recycled materials they would like to use to make a bird feeder to hang outside at Hawkins STEMM Academy. They designed their bird feeders on paper and then built them according to their plan. They tested them with seed in the feeder and redesigned as necessary. Finally, they hung their bird feeders outside for the birds to eat out of. (photos below)

Dress Code

We have adopted the following dress code for all students who attend Hawkins STEMM Academy. It is expected that all students will comply with the dress code, beginning with the first day of school. Parents and students are equally responsible for the appearance of the student.

Any color or pattern; No graphics or text.
The state of the s
Blouses, dress shirts, polo shirts, and button down shirts with a collar as well as turtle-necks, sweaters/cardigans (no hoods), TPS/HAWKINS spirit wear t-shirts or sweatshirts (crew neck only, no hoodies).
Collars must be worn at all times with the exception of spirit wear.
Solid colors are encouraged but not limited to blue/navy, khaki/tan, black, brown, or gray; No graphics or text. Skirts, jumpers, dress or casual pants, slacks, corduroy pants, shorts, capris, and skorts. All items must be just above knee length or longer. No jeans, jeggings, leggings, yoga pants or sweat suits permitted.
Any color or pattern; No graphics or text. Cardigans, pullovers, jackets or vest in any color fleece or fabric. Light weights jackets only. No hoods permitted on items. Collars must be worn at all times with the exception of spirit wear.
Any color or pattern; No graphics or text Shoes/Boots/Tennis Shoes with enclosed heels and toes. No platforms, slippers, slides, or Crocs.

Students who do not comply with the dress code are subject to progressive disciplinary action.

Important Building Procedures

- Security We are continuing a security and contact tracing requirement that EVERY person who enters the building must provide their state ID in the main office. The ID will be scanned by the RAPTOR Visitor Management System. This system screens and tracks everyone coming in and out of TPS buildings. Accurate and reliable visitor details and sign-in history are recorded for every visitor that enters our schools which includes COVID questioning for tracing purposes if needed. The system checks visitors against a custom database set by TPS, which may contain custody alerts and/or banned visitors.
- Early Pickup The end of the school day at Hawkins tends to be very busy. If your child needs to be released early, please do so before 2:45 p.m. No exceptions!
- Dismissal Please follow all staff directions at dismissal. Just a reminder, we need to leave space for the busses to park and to follow the appropriate traffic patterns at dismissal. Students K-1 are dismissed at 3:10 p.m. and grades the rest of the building begins to dismiss at 3:15 p.m.
